IN THE WAKE OF THE CETACEANS

In the early morning, when nature wakes up, board our va'a (traditional canoe) and learn to sail like us Polynesians. You will paddle towards the pass, where the lagoon meets the ocean, accompanied by one of the naturalist guides of Oceania, a local association dedicated to the protection of the marine megafauna of Polynesia. During this walk in fifty shades of blue, majestic landscapes parade and the marine fauna reveals itself to you. If you're lucky, you'll see a school of dolphins* playing and, why not, a humpback whale passing by.

*Cetaceans are animals in very large spaces. They are wild animals, so we cannot guarantee their presence at every exit. This is why the tour we offer you will make you discover cetaceans, if nature allows it, as well as the whole marine biodiversity.

In the heart of the valley, on the banks of a river with translucent water, let yourself be guided by one of our purotu (beautiful women) for a typically Polynesian beauty ritual during which you will learn some of the recipes and beauty secrets of the vahine.
